Privacy notice

Aimhigher London creates opportunities for young people from all backgrounds to have equal access to Higher Education. We are funded by our members: universities, schools, colleges and local authorities and government agencies (such as the Office for Students and the London Mayor's Office). Our members and funders want to know that we are using their money wisely. They want to know that we are working with young people who will benefit from our activities, and that those activities are having an impact.

For this reason, we collect data from young people and practitioners who take part in our activities. Information we collect are things like your plans for the future, and your attitudes to higher education. We also ask for things like your postcode and ethnicity because our members and funders want to know which areas of London and which schools we have worked in, and the backgrounds of the people we have seen. All personal data will be processed and stored securely by Aimhigher London in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations, 2018.

The data will help us understand whether our activities have made a difference. When we share this data with our members and funders, your name will never be used without yours or your parents' permission and we will ensure that it will not be possible to identify you from this data.

You do not have to give us any information if you are not happy for us to store it and use it to track progress through to university. This will not affect your eligibility to take part in our activities.

You may request details of any personal information we hold about you under the Data Protection Act 1998. If you believe that any of the information we hold on you is incorrect or incomplete, please contact us as soon as possible, we will correct any information found to be incorrect.
