


## KEY STAGE 3 EVENTS

Key Stage 3 events raise awareness of Higher Education and the steps to get there

**73%** of all Key Stage 3 learners said that after the events, they are more likely to go to university



**85%** of SEND learners said that after the events, they are more likely to go to university



## KEY STAGE 4 EVENTS

Key Stage 4 events raise aspirations to go to higher education

**65%** of all KS4 learners were more encouraged to think about their futures and how to get there

**71%** of BAME learners were encouraged to think about their futures and how to get there

## KEY STAGE 5 EVENTS

Key Stage 5 events support application and progression to Higher Education



**84%** stated they would now be more likely to complete their application before the school deadline



**82%** stated they now felt more prepared for the application process
