

Applying for Degree Apprenticeships in England

What is a Degree Apprenticeship?

A Degree Apprenticeship blends working for an employer with studying at university to gain a degree or masters. A Degree Apprenticeship usually takes 3-6 years and an apprentice will spend approximately 80% of their time with the employer and the rest of the time at university.

Who can apply for a Degree Apprenticeship?

Degree Apprenticeships are suitable for school leavers with A-levels or equivalent, or those who already have a degree, as well as mature students.

Does an individual need to pay for a Degree Apprenticeship?

The good news is that the individuals on an apprenticeship do not need to pay! The apprenticeship is fully funded by the employer and/or the government. Not only does the apprentice get valuable insight into their chosen industry by working for them, but they also get paid to work and study. The salary is at least usually £20,000 per year - win-win!

What if an individual does not have the grades to apply for a Degree apprenticeship?

If an individual is unsure whether they meet the requirements for a degree apprenticeship, it is important that they speak to someone who can help e.g. someone at school, a trusted adult, a careers advisor or organisations such as the Department for Education Apprenticeship and Skills Team at nationalhelpdesk@findapprenticeships.service.gov.uk or on 08000 150 600.

How does someone apply for a degree apprenticeship?

Applications for degree apprenticeship take place throughout the year. Employers will state a deadline to submit the application, as well as a start date. To apply for a degree apprenticeship, an application will need to be completed, along with a C.V. and cover letter. Advice on how to complete these can be sought from school/college, possibly your Virtual School or the National Careers Service on 0800 100 900.

If an individual is unsure how to complete either of these, they could ask for help from school/college and possibly their Virtual School.

It is important to note that apprentices will not be eligible for a student loan.

Things to consider before applying for a degree apprenticeship

- If you leave the apprenticeship early an employer could ask for some of the tuition fees to be paid back.
- An apprentice's experience at university won't be the same as it is for other undergraduates who are not on an apprenticeship.
- An apprentice will be still eligible for student discounts and a student bank account!
- There is no guarantee of a job at the end; however, an apprentice will have gained a lot of valuable experience and a degree and many employers will give a position at the end of an apprenticeship e.g. 30% of Rolls Royce senior managers started as apprentices!
